

MISSED, MISQUOTED, & MISUNDERSTOOD?

Part 9

Daniel 2:26-34 AMPC

26 The king said to Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, Are you able to make known to me the dream which I have seen and the interpretation of it?

27 Daniel answered the king, The [mysterious] secret which the king has demanded neither the wise men, enchanters, magicians, nor astrologers can show the king,

28 But there is a God in heaven Who reveals secrets, and He has made known to King Nebuchadnezzar what it is that shall be in the latter days (at the end of days). Your dream and the visions in your head upon your bed are these:

29 As for you, O king, as you were lying upon your bed thoughts came into your mind about what should come to pass hereafter, and He Who reveals secrets was making known to you what shall come to pass.

30 But as for me, this secret is not revealed to me for any wisdom that I have more than anyone else living, but in order that the interpretation may be made known to the king and that you may know the thoughts of your heart and mind.

31 You, O king, saw, and behold, [there was] a great image. This image which was mighty and of exceedingly great brightness stood before you, and the appearance of it was frightening and terrible.

32 As for this image, its head was of fine gold, its breast and its arms of silver, its belly and its thighs of bronze,

33 Its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay [the baked clay of the potter].

34 As you looked, **a Stone was cut out without human hands,** which smote the image on its feet of iron and [baked] clay [of the potter] and broke them to pieces.

First, Daniel told the King what he dreamt and then the meaning of the dream in the following verses...

Daniel 2:26-34 AMPC

41 And as you saw the feet and toes, partly of [baked] clay [of the potter] and partly of iron, it shall be a divided kingdom; but there shall be in it some of the firmness and strength of iron, just as you saw the iron mixed with miry [earthen] clay.

42 And as the toes of the feet were partly of iron and partly of [baked] clay [of the potter], so the kingdom shall be partly strong and partly brittle and broken.

43 And as you saw the iron mixed with miry and earthen clay, so they shall mingle themselves in the seed of men [in marriage bonds]; but they will not hold together [for two such elements or ideologies can never harmonize], even as iron does not mingle itself with clay.

44 And in the days of these [final ten] kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed, nor shall its sovereignty be left to another people; but it shall break and crush and consume all these kingdoms and it shall stand forever.

45 Just as you saw that **the Stone was cut out of the mountain without hands** and that it broke in pieces the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver, and the gold, the great God has made known to the king what shall come to pass hereafter. The dream is certain and the interpretation of it is sure.

This is Jesus referencing the very “thing” that was spoken by the “Never Wrong” Prophet Daniel...

Matthew 21:42 AMPC

42 Jesus asked them, Have you never read in the Scriptures: The very Stone which the builders rejected and threw away has become the Cornerstone;

Jesus continuously revealed who He was - “The son of God”.

John 5: 20-29 AMPC

20 The Father dearly loves the Son and discloses to (shows) Him everything that He Himself does. And He will disclose to Him (let Him see) greater things yet than these, so that you may marvel and be full of wonder and astonishment.

21 Just as the Father raises up the dead and gives them life [makes them live on], even so the Son also gives life to whomever He wills and is pleased to give it.

22 Even the Father judges no one, for He has given all judgment (the last judgment and the whole business of judging) entirely into the hands of the Son,

23 So that all men may give honor (reverence, homage) to the Son just as they give honor to the Father. [In fact] whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, Who has sent Him.

24 I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, the person whose ears are open to My words [who listens to My message] and believes and trusts in and clings to and relies on Him Who sent Me has (possesses now) eternal life....

...And he does not come into judgment [does not incur sentence of judgment, will not come under condemnation], but he has already passed over out of death into life.

25 Believe Me when I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, **the time is coming and is here now when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear it shall live.**

26 For even as the Father has life in Himself and is self-existent, so **He has given to the Son** to have life in Himself and be self-existent.

27 And He has given Him authority and granted Him power to execute (exercise, practice) judgment because He is a Son of man [very man].

28 **Do not be surprised and wonder at this, for the time is coming when all those who are in the tombs shall hear His voice,**

29 **And they shall come out—those who have practiced doing good [will come out] to the resurrection of [new] life,** and those who have done evil will be raised for judgment [raised to meet their sentence].

John 8:19-28 AMPC

19 Then they said to Him, Where is this Father of Yours? Jesus answered, **You know My Father as little as you know Me.** If you knew Me, you would know My Father also.

20 Jesus said these things in the treasury while He was teaching in the temple [court]; but no one ventured to arrest Him, **because His hour had not yet come.**

21 Therefore He said again to them, I am going away, and you will be looking for Me, and you will die in (under the curse of) your sin. Where I am going, it is not possible for you to come.

22 *At this the Jews began to ask among themselves, Will He kill Himself? Is that why He says, Where I am going, it is not possible for you to come?*

23 *He said to them, You are from below; I am from above. You are of this world (of this earthly order); I am not of this world.*

24 *That is why I told you that you will die in (under the curse of) your sins; for if you do not believe that I am He [Whom I claim to be—if you do not adhere to, trust in, and rely on Me], you will die in your sins.*

25 *Then they said to Him, Who are You anyway? Jesus replied, [Why do I even speak to you!] I am exactly what I have been telling you from the first.*

26 *I have much to say about you and to judge and condemn. But He Who sent Me is true (reliable), and I tell the world [only] the things that I have heard from Him.*

27 *They did not perceive (know, understand) that He was speaking to them about the Father.*

28 *So Jesus added, When you have lifted up the Son of Man [on the cross], you will realize (know, understand) that I am He [for Whom you look] and that I do nothing of Myself (of My own accord or on My own authority), but I say [exactly] what My Father has taught Me.*

John wrote the spirit of the antichrist would not acknowledge that Jesus the Christ had come in the flesh and would deny that Jesus is of or the son of God in 1 John. This non belief is considered blasphemy. In Revelation chapter 13 John wrote that 7th beast would come down from Iraq (foretold in Daniel) with blasphemy on their foreheads and being the 8th beast of Empire.



Shahada written on the green bandanas (green representing the color of Islam) states: There is no deity but allah, Muhammad is the Messenger of allah and allah has no sons

Much of the “End Time” prophecy in the Bible deals with the Jews, Israel and the Temple Mount. Also, the Bible says that His own wold question was Jesus the promised Messiah and the son of God. For the orthodox jews, Jesus was not the promised messiah and for the muslims their God has no son(s).

Regarding the Temple Mount, the land of Israel and the jewish people, what other movement or group of people is against the Jews, desire the land of Israel and wants the Temple mount?... The Bible tell us in the Old Testament that this spirit of the antichrist will get the entire world to come up against the jews through deception and threats of violence.

Matthew 24:5-10 AMPC

*5 For **many will come in (on the strength of) My name** [appropriating the name which belongs to Me], saying, I am the Christ (the Messiah), and they **will lead many astray**.*

6 And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you are not frightened or troubled, for this must take place, but the end is not yet.

*7 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be **famines and earthquakes in place after place;***

8 All **this is but the beginning** [the early pains] of the birth pangs [of the intolerable anguish].

9 Then they will hand you over to suffer affliction and tribulation and put you to death, and **you will be hated by all nations for My name's sake.**

10 And then **many will be offended** and repelled and will begin to distrust and desert [Him Whom they ought to trust and obey] and **will stumble and fall away and betray one another and pursue one another with hatred.**

Islam and Christianity both share many similarities in regards to their religious teachings from the the Bible and Islams 2 holy books the Quran and Hadith. The Bible written over thousands of years and ending with the writings of John in the book of Revelation was finished being written almost 600 years before Islam was created.

Here are just some of the adopted similarities that Islam chose to create this hybrid anti christ government/religion taking from the jewish teaching/practices and christianity, encompassing both the Old and New Testament.

This is part of the great deception that was foretold by Jesus Himself that would take place prior to the rapture of the church and for the 7 years after until the consummation of age which occurs at His Second coming to earth. Jesus will set up His earthly kingdom for 1,000 years after the 7 year Tribulation.

Here are just some of the similarities:

O Both believe history is linear and purposeful - that time moves in a straight line from creation to a final, permanent, unrepeatable end.

O Both believe in the physical resurrection of the dead - that every human being who has ever lived will be physically raised from the dead at the appointed time.

O Both believe in a final judgment of all humanity - both teach that every human soul will stand before God (Yahweh/Jehovah vs. allah) and face a comprehensive accounting of their life.

O Both teach real eternal consequences in paradise and hell - affirm that the outcome of the final judgment is permanent and of infinite consequence. The righteous enter a state of eternal joy and closeness to God (Yahweh/Jehovah vs. allah). The wicked face a state of punishment and separation from God.

O Both describe a period of moral and social decline before the end - the world will experience a dramatic deterioration of moral/social conditions leading up to the final events.

The signs in both traditions describe a world that looks remarkably similar: rulers who steal, scholars who sell their knowledge, the breakdown of family bonds, the normalization of sexual immorality, the proliferation of false religious teachers, widespread violence, and the replacement of truth with power as the measure of what is right.

O Both prominently feature the physical return of Jesus - this is the similarity that surprises people most. Both Christianity and Islam teach that Jesus of Nazareth physically departed from the earth, is currently in a heavenly state, and will physically return to earth at a decisive moment before the final judgment to play a central role in the end-times events.

The specific nature of that return, what Jesus does when he arrives, what his identity is, and what his return accomplishes, differs fundamentally between the two traditions.

But the bare fact of his return is affirmed by both. For Muslims encountering this for the first time, it can seem puzzling: if Jesus was not crucified and is not divine, why does he return at all?

Note: Islam teaches that Jesus was a prophet, disappeared, did not die on a cross and comes back during their 7 year tribulation and tells everyone to worship allah.

O Both describe a great deceiver before the end - a person of extraordinary power and deception who will appear, perform miracles, claim divine authority, and lead the majority of humanity astray before being defeated by the returning Jesus.

In Christianity this figure is called the false prophet, in Islam he is called the Dajjal, the False Messiah or the Great Deceiver.

O Both feature Gog and Magog - The Bible and the Quran reference a destructive force called Gog and Magog (Yajuj wa Majuj in Arabic). The Quran mentions them in two places: in Surah Al-Kahf (18:94-98) in the story of Dhul-Qarnayn who builds a great iron and copper wall to contain them, and in Surah Al-Anbiya (21:96) which refers to their release as a sign of the approaching hour.

In the Bible, they appear in Ezekiel 38-39 as a military coalition attacking Israel in the end times, and again in Revelation 20 as nations gathered for the final rebellion against God's kingdom after the Millennium. In both religions, they represent a force of mass destruction that will be unleashed near the end of the world and then defeated by divine intervention.

The specific narratives differ significantly.

The "Never Wrong" Prophet Isaiah said....

Isaiah 46:9-10 AMPC

9 [Earnestly] remember the former things, [which I did] of old; for I am God, and there is no one else; I am God, and there is none like Me,

*10 **Declaring the end and the result from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done,** saying, My counsel shall stand, and ***I will do all My pleasure and purpose.****

Daniel 12 AMPC

1 **And at that time [of the end] Michael shall arise, the great [angelic] prince who defends and has charge of your [Daniel's] people. And there shall be a time of trouble, straitness, and distress such as never was since there was a nation till that time.** But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone **whose name shall be found written in the Book [of God's plan for His own].**

2 And **many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake: some to everlasting life and some to shame and everlasting contempt and abhorrence.**

3 **And the teachers and those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the firmament,** and those who turn many to righteousness (to uprightness and right standing with God) [shall give forth light] like the stars forever and ever.

4 But you, **O Daniel, shut up the words and seal the Book until the time of the end. [Then] many shall run to and fro and search anxiously [through the Book], and knowledge [of God's purposes as revealed by His prophets] shall be increased and become great.**

11 **And from the time that the continual burnt offering is taken away and the abomination that makes desolate is set up, there shall be 1,290 days.**

Matthew 24:15 AMPC So when you see the appalling sacrilege [the abomination that astonishes and makes desolate], spoken of by the prophet Daniel, standing in the Holy Place—let the reader take notice and ponder and consider and heed [this]

13 But you [Daniel, who was now over ninety years of age], go your way until the end; **for you shall rest and shall stand [fast] in your allotted place at the end of the days.**

Islamic Terms:

Islam: government and not just religion (will kill false prophet or dajjal). The Arabic word Islam literally means "submission" or "surrender" to the will of God (known as Allah in Arabic), and it shares a root with the Arabic word salaam, which means "peace". Islam began in 610 CE when the Prophet Muhammad received his first divine revelations from the archangel Gabriel in the Cave of Hira near Mecca.

Note: Followers believe God (allah) sent various prophets throughout history, including Abraham, Moses, and Jesus, with the Prophet Muhammad being the final messenger.

Mohammad: considered by Muslims to be the final prophet and messenger of God. 610 AD: Muhammad, at about 40 years old, experienced his first revelation and began preaching the message of monotheism (belief in their created God, allah).

622 AD: The Hijra (migration) occurred, where Muhammad and his persecuted followers moved from Mecca to Medina. This year marks the start of the Islamic calendar. 632 AD: Muhammad died, but by then, he had united the Arabian Peninsula under Islam.

Muslim: a person who practices Islam—meaning someone who has submitted themselves to God.

Imam: a religious community leader in Islam, whose main responsibility is to lead prayers and deliver sermons on Fridays. Arabic means "to stand in front of."

Caliph: a supreme political and religious leader of the Muslim community, considered a successor to the Prophet Muhammad

Note: An imam is a leader of prayer or a religious guide, while a caliph is a political and administrative head of the worldwide Muslim state. The definitions and relationship between these two titles vary significantly between Sunni and Shia Islam.

Imam (Leader):

In everyday Sunni usage, an Imam is the person who leads the congregation in ritual daily prayers at a mosque, or a respected scholar of faith. The position is not hereditary or divinely appointed in mainstream Sunni tradition; anyone with proper knowledge and character can serve as an imam.

Caliph (Successor):

The Caliph (Khalifa) is the political successor to Prophet Muhammad as the leader of the Ummah (the global Muslim community). The caliph is responsible for governing the state, maintaining justice, and applying Sharia law, functioning primarily as a temporal head of state

Note: An ayatollah is a high-ranking title for expert religious leaders in Twelver Shia Islam.

Caliphate: an Islamic state led by a supreme religious and political leader known as a caliph, who is considered a successor to the Prophet Muhammad

Sharia Law: religious and moral code of Islam, serving as a comprehensive guide for Muslims on how to live according to God's wishes and the punishment for disobedience. In countries with large Muslim populations, the implementation of Sharia varies widely. Some nations use it only for personal status matters (like marriage, divorce, and inheritance), while others incorporate its principles into broader civil or criminal legal systems.

Dajjal: (the lying or false Messiah) is an antagonistic, deceptive figure in Islamic eschatology who will appear at their time of the end.

Mahdi: Islamic messianic and eschatological figure, who is to appear during the End Times to restore justice and defeat tyranny. Taught that he currently hiding in the mountains outside of Nineveh in Iraq. Iran must start the end time attack in Israel to wake up the muslims across the world in order of the mahdi to come forth. In Shia Islam, the Mahdi is considered to be the 12th Imam.

Sunni: follower of the largest branch of Islam, representing the vast majority of Muslims globally. The word Sunni comes from sunnah, which means the path, habits, and traditions of the Prophet Muhammad. Sunnis believe that the early leaders of Islam (called caliphs) should be chosen by the community, rather than being direct blood relatives of Muhammad.

Note: Predominantly Sunni Arab Nations- North Africa: Egypt, Libya, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco, and Sudan. The Levant & Middle East: Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Syria Palestine, Qatar, and the United Arab Emirates

Shia: second-largest branch of Islam, defined by the belief that leadership after the Prophet Muhammad rightfully belonged to his cousin and son-in-law, Ali ibn Abi Talib, and his direct descendants. They follow the line of Imams from the Prophet's bloodline, believing their leadership was divinely designated.

Note: Iraq and Bahrain are the only Arab nations with a majority Shia Muslim population. Iraq is 40% Sunni, 40 Shia and 20% Kurd

Kurds (in Iraq): indigenous, distinct ethnic group separate from Iraq's Arab majority. They primarily inhabit the mountainous northern and northeastern region of Iraq known as Iraqi Kurdistan or Southern Kurdistan

Note: Iraq is 40% Sunni, 40 Shia and 20% Kurd

Khorasan area: 70% of Iran, 15% Pakistan and 15% Afghanistan. Islam teaches this area must start the attack in Israel to sound the alarm to muslims around the world to begin the last one world government and religion or caliphate.

ISIS: Islamic State of Iraq and Syria

ISIL: Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant. This is an expanded area desired by Islam to control which included the eastern Mediterranean area from Egypt to Turkey and out Jordan. Including Lebanon, Israel, Syria etc.

Revelation 6:1-7 AMPC

1 Then I saw as the Lamb broke open one of the seven seals, and as if in a voice of thunder I heard one of the four living creatures call out, Come!

*2 And I looked, and **saw there a white horse** whose rider carried a bow. And a crown was given him, and he rode forth conquering and to conquer.*

3 And when He broke the second seal, I heard the second living creature call out, Come!

*4 And another **horse came out, flaming red**. And its rider was empowered to take the peace from the earth, so that men slaughtered one another; and he was given a huge sword.*

*5 When He broke open the third seal, I heard the third living creature call out, Come and look! And I saw, **and behold, a black horse**, and in his hand the rider had a pair of scales (a balance).*

6 And I heard what seemed to be a voice from the midst of the four living creatures, saying, A quart of wheat for a denarius [a whole day's wages], and three quarts of barley for a denarius; but do not harm the oil and the wine!

7 When the Lamb broke open the fourth seal, I heard the fourth living creature call out, Come!

*8 So I looked, and behold, an **ashy pale horse [black and blue as if made so by bruising]**, and its rider's name was Death,*

Note: 14 translations use “pale green” horse in verse 8

The four historic Islamic dynasties (or caliphates/royal houses) that inspired the traditional Pan-Arab colors (black, white, green, and red) used in many modern Middle Eastern flags are:



- O Umayyad Dynasty (661–750 CE) – White
- O Abbasid Caliphate (750–1258 CE) – Black
- O Fatimid Caliphate (909–1171 CE) – Green
- O Hashemite Dynasty / Early Arab Tribes – Red
