1 Peter 3:14-17 AMPC

14 *But even in case you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, [you are] blessed (happy, to be envied). Do not dread or be afraid of their threats, nor be disturbed [by their opposition].*

15 But in your hearts set Christ apart as holy [and acknowledge Him] as Lord. Always be ready to give a logical defense to anyone who asks you to account for the hope that is in you, but do it courteously and respectfully.

16 *[And see to it that] your conscience is entirely clear ([a]unimpaired), so that, when you are falsely accused as evildoers, **those who threaten you abusively and revile your right behavior in Christ may come to be ashamed [of slandering your good lives].***

17 *For **[it is] better to suffer [unjustly] for doing right,** if that should be God's will, **than to suffer [justly] for doing wrong.***

Psalm 119:130 AMPC

130 *The entrance and **unfolding of Your words give light;** their unfolding **gives understanding (discernment and comprehension)** to the simple.*

Science continues to prove the Bible is true...

2 Peter 1:19-20 AMPC

19 **And we have the prophetic word [made] firmer still.** You will do well to pay close attention to it as to a lamp shining in a dismal (squalid and dark) place, until the day breaks through [the gloom] and the Morning Star rises ([a]comes into being) in your hearts.

Psalm 8:3 AMPC

3 **When I view and consider** Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars, which You have ordained and established,

Colossians 2:8 AMPC

8 See to it that no one carries you off as spoil or makes you yourselves captive by his so-called philosophy and intellectualism and vain deceit (idle fancies and plain nonsense), following human tradition (men's ideas of the material rather than the spiritual world), **just crude notions following the rudimentary and elemental teachings of the universe and disregarding [the teachings of] Christ (the Messiah).**

In part 8 and part 9 we have looked in God's Word and natural or secular science regarding the evidence or facts that Dinosaurs have lived in the last 6 thousand years. Remember, the word dinosaur was created in 1841 to describe animals that were once referred to as large lizards, dragons, monsters etc., and the King James Bible for instance was written in 1611 so... you won't see the word dinosaur in there but they existed.

I will be using the KJV version for the main text in part 10 and I will be showing you the reason why as we continue in our unfolding of God's Word. Studying God's Word will bring light or clarity to what a godless education, government, media and science system has tried to keep people in the dark about...God created everything.

Psalm 119:130 AMPC

130 The entrance and **unfolding of Your words give light; their unfolding gives understanding (discernment and comprehension)** to the simple.

We learned last week in the book of Psalms about David recalling when God delivered His people from Egypt and how he fed them...

Psalm 74:13-15 KJV

13 Thou didst divide the sea by thy strength: thou brakest the heads of the dragons in the waters.

14 Thou brakest the heads of leviathan in pieces, and gavest him to be meat to the people inhabiting the wilderness.

15 Thou didst cleave the fountain and the flood: thou driedst up mighty rivers.

Psalm 74:13-15 ESV

13 You divided the sea by your might; you broke the heads of the sea monsters[a] on the waters.

14 You crushed the heads of Leviathan; you gave him as food for the creatures of the wilderness.

15 You split open springs and brooks; you dried up ever-flowing streams.

We are going to look at the book of Job and let the unfolding of His Word give more light and understanding (discernment and comprehension) and make the answers very simple.

Job 1:1 KJV

*1 There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and **that man was perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil.***

Eschewed defined: deliberately avoid, abstain from.

Job 1:2-3 KJV

2 And there were born unto him seven sons and three daughters.

3 His substance also was seven thousand sheep, and three thousand camels, and five hundred yoke of oxen, and five hundred she asses, and a very great household; so that this man was the greatest of all the men of the east.

Job was very wealthy...

Job 1:14-17 KJV

14 And there came a messenger unto Job, and said, The oxen were plowing, and the asses feeding beside them:

15 And the Sabeans fell upon them, and took them away; yea, they have slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

16 While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The fire of God is fallen from heaven, and hath burned up the sheep, and the servants, and consumed them; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

17 While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The Chaldeans made out three bands, and fell upon the camels, and have carried them away, yea, and slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

18 While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, Thy sons and thy daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house:

19 And, behold, there came a great wind from the wilderness, and smote the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young men, and they are dead; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

Job is having a really bad day...lost all of his animals and all of his children died. This is how Job replied...

Job 1:20-22 KJV

20 Then Job arose, and rent his mantle, and shaved his head, and fell down upon the ground, and worshipped,

21 And said, Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.

22 In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly.

I don't know about you... I would like to think I could of said that, thought like that and not sinned or blamed God for what just happened but, verse 22 is there for a reason. Job sinned not and did not blame God which would be foolish. Job just said thank you for letting me enjoy these things for a period of time. But then something else happened...

The devil gave Job boils...

Job 2:7 KJV

7 So went Satan forth from the presence of the Lord, and smote Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot unto his crown.

Physically things were now going bad and then, his wife said curse God and die...great support system.

Job 2:9-10 KJV

9 Then said his wife unto him, **Dost thou still retain thine integrity? curse God, and die.**

10 But he said unto her, **Thou speakest as one of the foolish women speaketh.** What? shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil? **In all this did not Job sin with his lips.**

Job 2:9-10 GNT

9 His wife said to him, **“You are still as faithful as ever, aren't you? Why don't you curse God and die?”**

10 Job answered, **“You are talking nonsense! When God sends us something good, we welcome it. How can we complain when he sends us trouble?”** **Even in all this suffering Job said nothing against God.**

Job 2:9-10 AMPC

9 Then his wife said to him, **Do you still hold fast your blameless uprightness? Renounce God and die!**

10 But he said to her, **You speak as one of the impious and foolish women would speak. What? Shall we accept [only] good at the hand of God and shall we not accept [also] misfortune and what is of a bad nature? In [spite of] all this, Job did not sin with his lips.**

Just like in Job 1:22, in spite of all of what was happening in Job's life, he did not sin with his lips. He would not speak evil against God for what was taking place in his life.

Then, his friends came to see him...

Job 2:11 KJV

11 Now when Job's three friends heard of all this evil that was come upon him, they came every one from his own place; Eliphaz the Temanite, and Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite: for they had made an appointment together to come to mourn with him and to comfort him.

For 35 chapters Job's friends told him why everything went wrong. They said, you sinned. That's not what happened but that is often taught... If something bad happens to someone or to their family... you and I don't always know what happened or why. We should love them, pray for them, encourage them and stop talking about them to everyone else.

Here's Job, scraping the puss off his sores, mourning the death of his children and wondering why this was happening...

Job 31:35 KJV

35 Oh that one would hear me! behold, my desire is, that the Almighty would answer me, and that mine adversary had written a book.

Job 31:35 AMPC

35 Oh, for a hearing! Oh, for an answer from the Almighty! Let my adversary write out His indictment [and put His vague accusations in tangible form] in a book!

Job was asking God... why is this happening to me? Has anyone asked God that question?

Let's read what Paul wrote...

Romans 8:28 KJV

28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

Romans 8:28 AMPC

28 We are assured and know that [God being a partner in their labor] all things work together and are [fitting into a plan] for good to and for those who love God and are called according to [His] design and purpose.

Paul is not stating that everything is good but that all things work together for good. All of these “things” have to be added together for the plan to be good or for God’s desired results, and you need to love God.

Have you ever been craving something to eat? Really hungry for something? Knowing this, I invite you over and offer you:

A cup of flour... not what you wanted?

How about... a teaspoon of salt? Not feeling it?

How about... a teaspoon of baking soda? Feeling a little dry?

How about... 2 cups of crisco? And a cup of buttermilk?

All of those things by themselves or even with the absence of one of them would not taste good, but all mixed together or all working together it makes biscuits for a Cream Puff Sunday.

Those “things” by themselves don’t taste good and you would never say give me one of those because I am so hungry and craving them but... all blended or working together, it is a biscuit used for a delicious desert!

So, all of these things combined are working together for good if you love God. If you are faithful, patient, trust the process that God has you going thru not just for someone else but for you.

Romans 8:28 KJV

28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

The key to all of this is to love God, to trust God while all of these “things” are coming together because we can become very impatient during the “baking process”. Make sure you and I trust God’s Word in all areas and things in our lives, the many questions we have about what is happening or what does it mean?

Jeremiah 17:9 KJV

*9 The **heart is deceitful** above all things, and **desperately wicked**: who can know it?*

In chapter 38, God or the Lord answers Job.

Job 38:1-2 KJV

*1 Then **the Lord answered Job** out of the whirlwind, and said,
2 **Who is this that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?***

This “dark counsel” in Job 38:2 which are words proceeding from ignorance, mistake, without understanding can be deceiving. Be careful on what you are reading and how you are reading it. There are things written in God’s Word that are quoting people, like Job’s friends. It is true Job’s friends said it but the words may not be true or line up with God’s Words.

From teachers, preachers, books about the Bible and translations... watch out for counsel that is dark or without God’s intent or His Light. God’s Word calls it dark counsel or deluding words, things that God never said.

Galatians 5:9 AMPC

9 A little leaven (a slight inclination to error, or a few false teachers) leavens the whole lump [it perverts the whole conception of faith or misleads the whole church].

Galatians 5:9 KJV

9 A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump.

1 Corinthians 5:1-13 AMPC

1 *It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you, impurity of a sort that is condemned and does not occur even among the heathen; for a man has [his own] father's wife.*

2 *And you are proud and arrogant! And you ought rather to mourn (bow in sorrow and in shame) until the person who has done this [shameful] thing is removed from your fellowship and your midst!*

3 *As for my attitude, though I am absent [from you] in body, I am present in spirit, and I have already decided and passed judgment, as if actually present,*

4 *In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, on the man who has committed such a deed. When you and my own spirit are met together with the power of our Lord Jesus,*

5 *You are to deliver this man over to Satan [a]for physical discipline [to destroy carnal lusts which prompted him to incest], that [his] spirit may [yet] be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus.*

6 *[About the condition of your church] your boasting is not good [indeed, it is most unseemly and entirely out of place]. Do you not know that [just] a little leaven will ferment the whole lump [of dough]?*

7 *Purge (clean out) the old leaven that you may be fresh (new) dough, still uncontaminated [as you are], for Christ, our Passover [Lamb], has been sacrificed.*

8 *Therefore, let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with leaven of vice and malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened [bread] of purity (nobility, honor) and sincerity and [unadulterated] truth.*

9 *I wrote you in my [previous] letter not to associate [closely and habitually] with unchaste (impure) people—*

10 *Not [meaning of course that you must] altogether shun the immoral people of this world, or the greedy graspers and cheats and thieves or idolaters, since otherwise you would need to get out of the world and human society altogether!*

11 *But now I write to you not to associate with anyone who bears the name of [Christian] brother if he is known to be guilty of immorality or greed, or is an idolater [whose soul is devoted to any object that usurps the place of God], ... **(next page)***

...or is a person with a foul tongue [railing, abusing, reviling, slandering], or is a drunkard or a swindler or a robber. [No] you must not so much as eat with such a person.

12 What [business] of mine is it and what right have I to judge outsiders? Is it not those inside [the church] upon whom you are to pass disciplinary judgment [passing censuring sentence on them as the facts require]?

13 God alone sits in judgment on those who are outside. Drive out that wicked one from among you [expel him from your church].

Back to Job 38...

Job 38:1-2 KJV

*1 Then **the Lord answered Job** out of the whirlwind, and said,*

*2 **Who is this that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?***

*3 **Gird up now thy loins like a man; for I will demand of thee, and answer thou me.***

God is asking Job where were you when I created everything? Where were you? Where was I?

Has it ever occurred to you that nothing ever occurred to God? Things occur to me all the time, things that have been that I didn't know or wasn't able to understand... that has never happened to God, nothing has ever occurred to God.

God knows the thoughts and imaginations of our minds...

1 Chronicles 28:9 KJV

*9 And thou, Solomon my son, know thou the God of thy father, **and serve him with a perfect heart and with a willing mind:** for the Lord searcheth all hearts, and **understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek him, he will be found of thee;** but if thou forsake him, he will cast thee off for ever.*

God not only knows our thoughts but the imaginations of the thoughts.

God knows our thoughts...

Psalm 94:11 KJV

11 The Lord knoweth the thoughts of man, that they are vanity.

Jesus knows our thoughts...

Luke 11:17 KJV

17 But he, knowing their thoughts, said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.

God asked Job a question(s) and Job did not answer...

Job 38:4-5 KJV

4 Where wast thou when I laid the foundations of the earth? declare, if thou hast understanding.

5 Who hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest? or who hath stretched the line upon it?

God asks Job another question...

Job 38:16 KJV

16 Hast thou entered into the springs of the sea? or hast thou walked in the search of the depth?

Did you know that scientists didn't know there were springs in the ocean until 1977?

Job 38:19 KJV

19 Where is the way where light dwelleth? and as for darkness, where is the place thereof,

Light does not stay in a place it is in a way... where is the place of the darkness? Darkness can't move.

Job 38:24 KJV

24 By what way is the light parted, which scattereth the east wind upon the earth?

Hold on, does the light cause the wind? Yes it does, ask any weatherman. The sunlight cause the ground to warm up which causes the air to warm up and it expands the air... the wind is caused by the sunlight. God said that thousands of years ago...

Job 38:35 KJV

35 Canst thou send lightnings, that they may go and say unto thee, Here we are?

Is God telling Job that electricity can be used to send a message?

God asked Job 84 questions and Job never answered God one of them.

Job 40:8-9 KJV

8 Wilt thou also disannul my judgment? wilt thou condemn me, that thou mayest be righteous?

9 Hast thou an arm like God? or canst thou thunder with a voice like him?

These kinds of questions don't need an answer, these questions are designed to change a persons attitude.

God is asking Job these questions to change his attitude...

Job 40:15 KJV

*15 Behold now **behemoth, which I made with thee**; he eateth grass as an ox.*

What is a behemoth? Some reference books on the Bible, study Bibles and even translations say it could be the elephant or hippopotamus... no, it can't be one of those. **I think the behemoth is the long neck dinosaur called the Brachiosaurus that God made along with man.**



Job 40:15 KJV

*15 Behold now behemoth, which I made with thee; **he eateth grass** as an ox.*

Well, elephants eat grass and some Bibles say elephant or hippo's...

Job 40:15 AMPC

*15 Behold now **the behemoth (the hippopotamus)**, which I created as I did you; he eats grass like an ox.*

Let's keep reading...Bible defines Bible.

Job 40:16 KJV

*16 See now, his strength is in his loins, and **his power is in the sinews of his belly.***

So, this animal has a big strong belly in verse 16...an elephant has a big belly but so does a hippopotamus and a brachiosaurus - very big belly.

Job 40:17 KJV

*17 He **moveth his tail like a cedar:** the sinews of his stones are wrapped together.*

Have you seen an elephants tail? How about the hippo's tail? Those are not like cedar trees are they? They are not moving like a cedar...

Let's look at the AMPC and compare it to itself...(I'm not burning my AMPC - but this is important to note how translations one verse apart can get it wrong)

Job 40:15-17 AMPC

*15 **Behold now the behemoth (the hippopotamus),** which I created as I did you; he eats grass like an ox.*

16 See now, his strength is in his loins, and his power is in the sinews of his belly.

*17 **He moves his tail like a cedar tree;** the tendons of his thighs are twisted together [like a rope].*



Job 40:18 KJV

18 His bones are as strong pieces of brass; his bones are like bars of iron.

Scientists believe that the Brachiosaurus could of weighed about 100 tons which is 14 school buses. The largest Brachiosaurus unearthed is 60 ft tall and was found in Oklahoma.

Job 40:19 KJV

*19 He is the **chief** of the ways of God: he that made him can make his sword to approach unto him.*

Chief in the Hebrew language means principle thing or biggest thing. This animal or behemoth is the biggest animal that God ever made. That would not be the hippo or the elephant...it would be the brachiosaurus.

It is important to slow the Bible reading down, look at the translations, get a good Bible teacher who rightly divides the Word and this is what will take place...

Psalm 119:130 AMPC

*130 The entrance and **unfolding of Your words give light; their unfolding gives understanding (discernment and comprehension)** to the simple.*

There is no question that God created everything “**In the Beginning**”

Genesis 1 KJV

*1 **In the beginning God** created the heaven and the earth.*

20 And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven.

21 And God created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good.

24 And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so.

25 And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that it was good.

26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.

28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.



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Job 1 AMPC

1 *There was a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job; and that man was blameless and upright, and one who [reverently] feared God and abstained from and shunned evil [because it was wrong].*

2 *And there were born to him seven sons and three daughters.*

3 *He possessed 7,000 sheep, 3,000 camels, 500 yoke of oxen, 500 female donkeys, and a very great body of servants, so that this man was the greatest of all the men of the East.*

4 His sons used to go and feast in the house of each on his day (birthday) in turn, and they invited their three sisters to eat and drink with them.

5 And when the days of their feasting were over, Job sent for them to purify and hallow them, and rose up early in the morning and offered burnt offerings according to the number of them all. For Job said, It may be that my sons have sinned and cursed or disowned God in their hearts. Thus did Job at all [such] times.

6 *Now there was a day when the sons (the angels) of God came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan (the adversary and accuser) also came among them.*

7 *And the Lord said to Satan, From where did you come? Then Satan answered the Lord, From going to and fro on the earth and from walking up and down on it.*

8 *And the Lord said to Satan, Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, one who [reverently] fears God and abstains from and shuns evil [because it is wrong]?*

9 *Then Satan answered the Lord, Does Job [reverently] fear God for nothing?*

10 Have You not put a hedge about him and his house and all that he has, on every side? You have conferred prosperity and happiness upon him in the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land.

11 *But put forth Your hand now and touch all that he has, and he will curse You to Your face.*

12 And the Lord said to Satan (the adversary and the accuser), Behold, all that he has is in your power; only upon the man himself put not forth your hand. So Satan went forth from the presence of the Lord.

13 And there was a day when [Job's] sons and his daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house [on his birthday],

14 And there came a messenger to Job and said, The oxen were plowing and the donkeys feeding beside them,

15 And the Sabeans swooped down upon them and took away [the animals]. Indeed, they have slain the servants with the edge of the sword, and I alone have escaped to tell you.

16 While he was yet speaking, there came also another and said, The fire of God (lightning) has fallen from the heavens and has burned up the sheep and the servants and consumed them, and I alone have escaped to tell you.

17 While he was yet speaking, there came also another and said, The Chaldeans divided into three bands and made a raid upon the camels and have taken them away, yes, and have slain the servants with the edge of the sword, and I alone have escaped to tell you.

18 While he was yet speaking, there came also another and said, Your sons and your daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house,

19 And behold, there came a great [whirlwind] from the desert, and smote the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young people and they are dead, and I alone have escaped to tell you.

20 Then Job arose and rent his robe and shaved his head and fell down upon the ground and worshiped

21 And said, Naked (without possessions) came I [into this world] from my mother's womb, and naked (without possessions) shall I depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed (praised and magnified in worship) be the name of the Lord!

22 In all this Job sinned not nor charged God foolishly.
